Questions to answer at the end of a book

- 1. Which part of the story do you think you will remember most, and why?
- 2. What message do you think the author is trying to give through this book?
- 3. What would you have changed about the plot, or the ending, if anything?
- 4. What feeling(s) were you left with at the end of the book?
- 5. Which character do you feel you can relate to most, and why?
- 6. Share a favourite quote from the book. Why did this one stand out to you?
- 7. How well does the title/front cover convey what the book is about, now you've read it?
- 8. Is there anything in this book that makes you want to change the world? If so, what?
