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Introduction

The SEN and Disability Act 2001 extended the Disability Discrimination Act 1995 (DDA) to cover education. Since September 2002, the school has had three key duties towards disabled pupils, under Part 4 of the DDA:

- 1. not to treat disabled pupils less favourably for a reason related to their disability;
- 2. to make reasonable adjustments for disabled pupils, so that they are not at a substantial disadvantage;
- 3. to plan to increase access to education for disabled pupils.

This plan sets out the proposals of the Local Governing Body of the school to increase access to education for disabled pupils in the three areas required by the planning duties in the DDA:

- a) increasing the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the school curriculum;
- b) improving the environment of the school to increase the extent to which disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services;
- c) improving the delivery to disabled pupils of information, which is provided in writing for pupils who are not disabled.

It is a requirement that the school's accessibility plan is resourced, implemented, reviewed and revised as necessary and reported on annually.

We are working within a national framework for educational inclusion provided by:

- Equality Act 2010
- The SEN Revised Code of Practice 2015
- The Disability Discrimination Act 1995 (amended for schools in 2001)

Holmleigh Park High School

Holmleigh Park High School is an 11-18 mixed comprehensive school comprising of several separate buildings ('blocks') where teaching takes place. They are a combination of single and two-storey buildings. The school is set into a steady incline, but there is ground-level access to all buildings which can be used instead of internal staircases. The newly-built Maths block and Reception area contain lift access to upper floors. The school has disabled toilet facilities across the site and there is a restroom to facilitate the needs of students with physical disabilities.
